

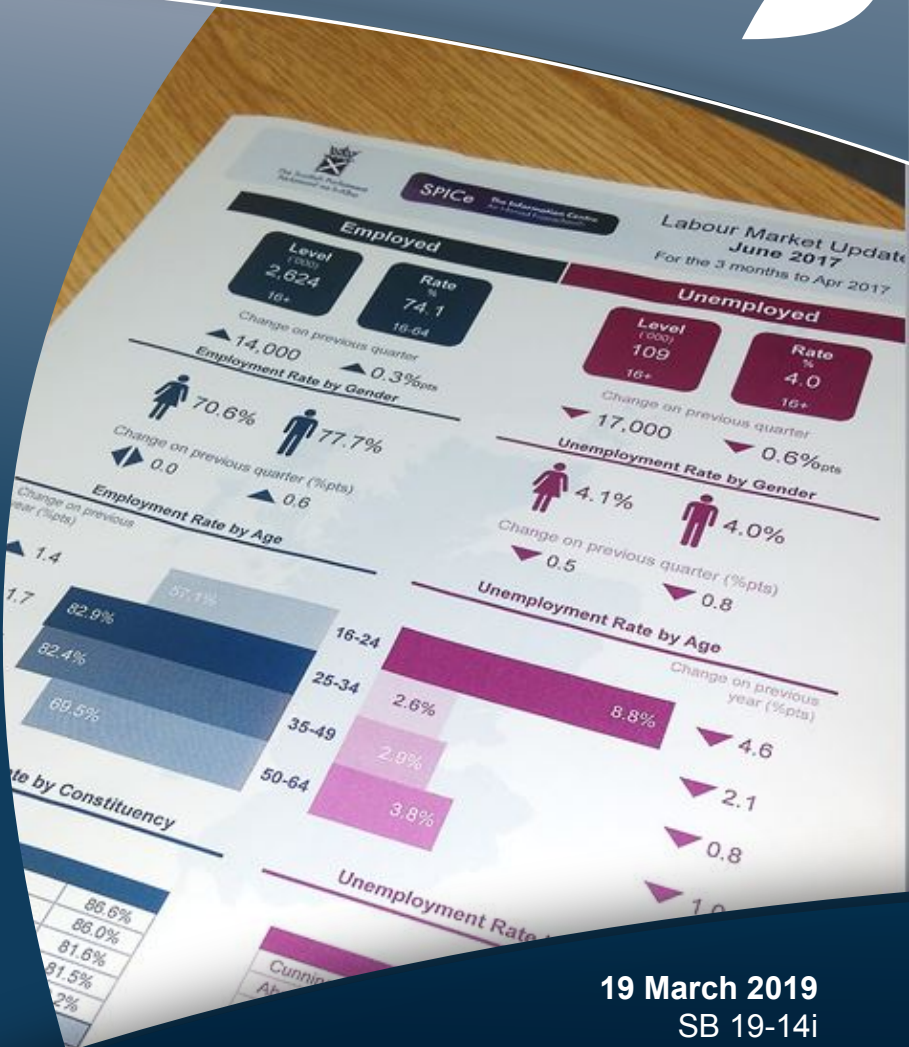

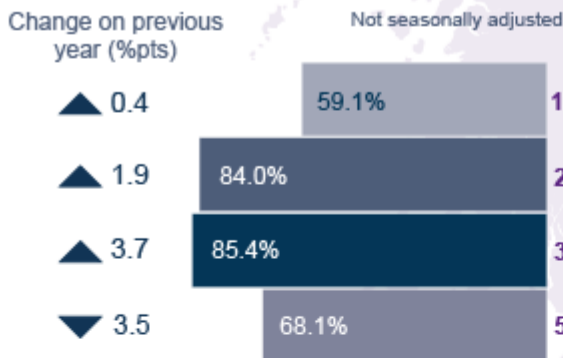
Employment Rate by Gender



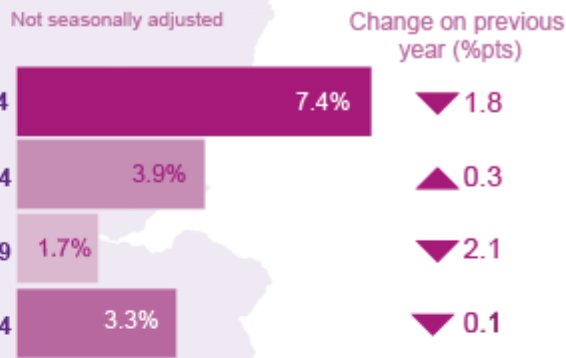
Unemployment Rate by Gender
