Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee

The remit of the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee is to consider and report on—

- (a) the practice and procedures of the Parliament in relation to its business;
- (ab) a proposal for a Bill relating to the arrangements for financial assistance to non-Government political parties represented in the Parliament;
- (b) whether a member's conduct is in accordance with these Rules and any Code of Conduct for members, matters relating to members interests, and any other matters relating to the conduct of members in carrying out their Parliamentary duties;
- (c) the adoption, amendment and application of any Code of Conduct for members; and
- (d) matters relating to public appointments in Scotland;
- (e) matters relating to the regulation of lobbying; and
- (f)matters relating to Scottish general elections falling within the responsibility of the Cabinet Secretary for Government Business and Constitutional Relations.

The Scottish Parliament (Constituencies and Regions) Order 2020 [draft]

- The Scottish Parliament (Constituencies and Regions) Order 2020 [draft] was laid before the Scottish Parliament on 31 August 2020 and referred to the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee (SPPA Committee).
- 2. The draft Order gives effect to the recommendations contained in the Report on Interim Review of Scottish Parliament Boundaries at Cardowan by Stepps by the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland of March 2020.
- 3. The report recommends changes to the constituency and region boundary between Glasgow Provan constituency and Coatbridge and Chryston constituency and between Glasgow region and Central Scotland Region. The changes are set out in the map included in the explanatory notes to the instrument.
- 4. The draft Order defines the name, status and area of 70 of the 73 Scottish Parliament constituencies and the name and area of each Scottish Parliament region (The Na h-Eileanan an Iar, Orkney Islands and Shetland Islands constituencies are provided for in schedule 1 to the Scotland Act 1998 as amended by the Islands (Scotland) Act 2018). Other than the changes made to the Glasgow Provan constituency and Coatbridge and Chryston constituency and between Glasgow region and Central Scotland Region, these are the same as provided for by the Scottish Parliament (Constituencies and Regions) Order 2014. The area of each constituency is described in geographical information system data stored on a USB memory stick deposited with the Scottish Ministers.

Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee Consideration

The Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee (DPLRC) considered the draft 5. Order on 8 September 2020. The DPLRC's report indicates that it had no points to raise on the instrument.

SPPA Committee Consideration

- 6. Motion S5M-22061 was lodged by Graeme Dey, Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans, and supported by Michael Russell, Cabinet Secretary for Government Business and Constitutional Relations.
- 7. At the SPPA Committee's 17th Meeting on 1 October 2020, it took evidence on the Scottish Parliament (Constituencies and Regions) Order 2020 [draft] from—
 - Graeme Dey, Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans;
 - Alison Fraser, Legal Directorate, and Kenneth Pentland, Senior Policy Officer, Elections Team, Scottish Government.
- 8. Following the evidence session, Graeme Dey moved Motion S5M-22601 that the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee recommends that the Scottish Parliament (Constituencies and Regions) Order 2020 [draft] be approved.
- 9. The motion was agreed to without division.
